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# CHAPTER-I INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1 PREAMBLE

"Sports teaches you character, it teaches you to play by the rules, it teaches you to know what it feels like to win and lose-it teaches you about life."- Billie Jean King

Sports and games are essential components of a student's journey in Higher Education. It enhances self-esteem, improves self-confidence, and promotes a healthy and happy society. Sports and games are important in fostering social harmony, inculcating discipline, and helping in channelizing the vast youth potential.

To enhance the sports ecosystem at IIMT University, it is imperative to implement a clearly outlined sports policy that encompasses well-structured initiatives.

#### 1.2 SCOPE OF THE POLICY

The IIMT University Sports Policy is designed to deal with all prerequisites for optimum usage of resources provided in order to maintain good sportsmanship by students at IIMT University and with the visiting individuals & teams.

#### 1.3 MISSION

To ensure 'Sports for Everyone' through competitive and recreational sports.

#### 1.4 VISION

Development of a sustainable and diverse sports & recreation system that will provide a holistic learning experience.

# 1.5 OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Department of Physical Education & Sports are to:

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Fostering a culture of sports among students.

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- Encouraging active student involvement in sports and fostering a spirit of sportsmanship.
- Identifying sports talent and nurturing them to enhance their performance.
- Showcasing the University's capabilities by hosting national-level tournaments.
- Offering incentives and presenting awards to athletes, aiming to sustain interest and encourage continuous participation and improvement among students.
- Developing and maintaining high-quality sports facilities, including playing fields, gymnasiums, swimming pools, and track & field areas, and acquiring top-notch equipment to ensure excellent sporting infrastructure.
- Implementing a systematic coaching program with the engagement of qualified and competent personnel to mentor university teams and develop sports talent.
- Elevating student engagement in activities and events from grassroots levels,
   both within and beyond the university curriculum.
- Promoting the benefits of physical activity for both health and social wellbeing.
- Inculcate a sense of discipline and teamwork among students.



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# CHAPTER-II DEFINITIONS

- 2.1 Physical Education: Physical Education is essentially "education through physical activities," focusing on enhancing students' physical competence, knowledge of movement and safety, and their capacity to apply these skills across a diverse array of activities associated with cultivating an active and healthy lifestyle.
- **2.2 Sport:** An endeavor characterized by physical exertion and skill, guided by a set of rules or customs, and frequently pursued competitively.
- 2.3 Game: An activity designed for entertainment or amusement; a pastime.
- 2.4 Venues: Sports venues are those areasthat are provided permanently or temporarily to the Department of Physical Education & Sports by University management for activities.
- **2.5 Student Club Coordinator:** An individual who is given the responsibility to run a specific club and has expertise/specialization about that club.
- 2.6 School Sports Coordinator (Faculty/Staff): A member nominated by the respective school of the University who has the responsibility to coordinate with the Department of Physical Education for conducting different sports activities representing his/her school.
- **2.7 Duty Leave:** Any leave of absence/physical presence in the University campus/classroom due to an event is classified as duty leave.
- 2.8 Recreation: Any experience arising from voluntary engagement in physical, social, intellectual, creative, and spiritual activities that contribute to the well-being of students.

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
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# **CHAPTER-III**

# DEPARTMENT STRUCTURE, ROLES, AND RESPONSIBILITIES

#### 3.1 DEPARTMENT STRUCTURE

The organizational framework of the Department of Physical Education & Sports is illustrated in the following diagram.



# 3.2 ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

# 3.2.1 Department of Physical Education & Sports:

- Developing the agenda for discussions during University Sports Committee meeting(s).
- Identifying, training, coaching, and facilitating the participation in Inter-University tournaments and other sports competitions of University teams and individuals.

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- Coordinating and executing Inter-School competitions in different sports and games for University students.
- Managing the maintenance of sports infrastructure on the University campus in collaboration with administrative team.
- Handling reservations of sports infrastructure upon demand by external organizations for organizing tournaments and collecting the prescribed fees determined by the University Sports Committee.
- Conducting Workshops / Clinics / Seminars / Conferences / Referee's
   Examinations related to different sports activities and physical education, as
   well as coaches training programs in different sports.
- Assisting the University administration in processing applications, preparing merit order lists for sports scholarships awarded to exceptional athletes, and supporting the admission process for sportspersons under the Sports Quota.

# 3.2.2 Duties of Managers and Coaches Accompanying University Teams:

- The Director of Physical Education & Sports will appoint managers and coaches from the University.
- The Director of Physical Education & Sports will allocate the budget approved by the University Sports Committee, which will be disbursed to the team manager. Team managers are responsible for maintaining accounts following the guidelines provided by the Department of Physical Education & Sports office.
- Team managers will organize practice matches in coordination with the coaches.
- Team managers will gather all relevant tournament documents from the Department of Physical Education & Sports office.

• Team managers will coordinate the to & fro travel arrangements for teams in coordination with the coach, following the guidelines of the host University.

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- Team managers will update the Director of Physical Education & Sports on the day-to-day progress of the Inter-University tournaments/competitions.
- Team managers will submit all necessary documents to the organizing secretary of the Inter-University tournaments upon arrival at the venue.
- Team managers will distribute travel and daily allowances to team members in accordance with the University Sports Committee guidelines, obtaining receipts for the amounts paid.
- Team managers are required to submit detailed accounts, including an expenditure statement, upon returning from Inter-University tournaments, to the Department of Physical Education & Sports office.
- Team coaches will maintain attendance records for team players from the start of the coaching camp until the conclusion of the Inter-University tournaments/competition program.
- Team coaches will update the Director of Physical Education & Sports about any players not reporting to the coaching camp without a valid reason, enabling the Director to replace such players with stand-bys based on merit and team requirements.
- Team coaches will develop and maintain the training schedule for the team/individual players during the coaching camp, discussing it with the Director of Physical Education & Sports. Coaches will appropriately design the training schedule for individual participants, considering their previous training history to enhance their performance.
- Team coaches will keep a performance appraisal report for all team players in all matches/events, submitting it to the Director of Physical Education & Sports.
- Managers and coaches are responsible for ensuring team discipline, safety, and security throughout the coaching camp until the players return to the University after completing the tournaments/competitions.

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 Managers and coaches are required to submit a report on player conduct and tournament/competition results to the Director of Physical Education & Sports.

# 3.2.3 Duties and Responsibilities of Physical Education & Sports Staff:

# A. Dean/Director of Physical Education & Sports:

- Annually propose the constitution of the University Sports Committee to the University authorities.
- Conduct necessary staff meetings for the Department of Physical Education
   & Sports throughout each academic year to address regular programs and discuss matters related to the Department and University.
- Develop the program for University Sports activities at the commencement of each academic year.
- Coordinate meetings of the University Sports Committee in consultation with the Honourable Vice-Chancellor of IIMT University.
- Prepare an annual budget estimate for University Sports activities and present it to the University Sports Committee.
- Conduct trials for the selection of university teams participating in Inter-University tournaments/competitions.
- Annually coordinate and host University Inter-School competitions.
- Oversee the organization of Inter-University tournaments/competitions allocated by the Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi.
- Facilitate coaching camps for selected University teams in preparation for their involvement in Inter-University tournaments/competitions.
  - Manage the participation of University teams in various Inter-University tournaments/competitions organized by different Universities in India, as allocated by the Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi.

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- Ensure the acquisition of sports materials, track-suits, colors, etc., for the use of selected sportspersons in various University teams on an annual basis.
- Develop and oversee infrastructure facilities for both indoor and outdoor sports activities on the University campus.
- Propose the formation of a sports scholarship committee to the University adhering to established University norms.
- Supervise the annual process of awarding sports scholarships to exceptional athletes at the University.
- Coordinate workshops, seminars, clinics, conferences, etc., to enhance the knowledge of Physical Education & Sports staff and coaches in various sports and games.
- Attendthe International, National, Inter-University, and State levels of Physical Education & Sports Conferences, Seminars, Competitions, etc., to gain additional knowledge in areas such as administration, organization, sports, management, etc., in accordance with University norms.

# B. Deputy Director/Assistant Director of Physical Education & Sports:

- Supervise the sports activities of the University in alignment with the delegated responsibilities from the Director of Physical Education & Sports.
- Prepare an annual budget for sports activities, subject to approval by the Director of Physical Education & Sports.
- Annually select Men and Women teams for participation in University Inter-School and other tournaments at the commencement of each academic year with prior notification.
- Collaborate with the Director of Physical Education & Sports to submit team entries for participation in various tournaments.

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- Supervise the training schedule for athletes during practice sessions on regular working days, except for days assigned with other responsibilities by the Director of Physical Education & Sports.
- Regularly communicate information about University tournaments, selection trials, and other Physical Education & Sports activities to students through periodic notifications.
- Organize yearly sports activities for both students and staff throughout each academic year with the Director of Physical Education & Sports' approval.
- Ensure the upkeep of sports facilities within the University.
- Supervise the admission process for individuals using sports facilities, keeping records of fee collections in accordance with the guidelines set by the Department of Physical Education & Sports.
- Support with the Director of Physical Education & Sports to facilitate Inter-School tournaments, conduct physical fitness tests during team selection trials, and oversee annual summer coaching camps in different sports and games.
- Support the Director of Physical Education & Sports in carrying out delegated routine tasks of the department.
- Augment professional knowledge through active participation in Refresher and Orientation courses, Conferences, Seminars, Clinics, Workshops, Referees Examinations, etc., following the norms established by the University.

#### C. Coaches:

 Conduct coaching sessions for University players and teams during both morning and evening on regular working days, except when assigned other duties by the Director of Physical Education & Sports or University authorities.

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- Support the Director of Physical Education & Sports in administering physical fitness tests during the selection trials of players for University teams.
- Develop daily training schedules and provide training to sportspersons at the University.
- Conduct training sessions for University teams prior to their involvement in Inter-University tournaments.
- Support the Director of Physical Education & Sports in the organization of Inter-School, Inter-University, and additional tournaments.
- Support the Director of Physical Education & Sports in the execution of annual summer coaching camps on a yearly basis.
- Support the Director of Physical Education & Sports in carrying out delegated routine departmental tasks.
- Supervise the relevant playfields and ensure their upkeep in playing condition with the assistance of the ground staff from the Department of Physical Education & Sports.
- Augment professional expertise by participating in Refresher and Orientation courses, Conferences, Seminars, Clinics, Workshops, Referees' Examinations, etc., in accordance with the norms established by the University.

# 3.2.4 Club Coordinator:

- · Register and enroll students for club memberships.
- Ensure the proper display of sports-related information and notices for respective clubs on notice boards and formulate schedules for club activities.
- Collaborate with the Deputy/Assistant Director of Physical Education & Sports to allocate time, venues, grounds, and other necessary facilities for club members.

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Monitor the attendance of club members in club activities.

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- Enforce appropriate attire for students participating in club activities.
- Ensure that all activities adhere to the rules and regulations of federations and policies of IIMT University.
- Assist in the selection of students for AIU tournaments/competitions.
- Aid the purchase committee in procuring items related to the clubs.
- Manage and resolve disputes related to club activities, document dispute reports, and submit them to 'The Grievances and Dispute Resolution Committee.'
- Submit club requirements to the Deputy/Assistant Director of Physical Education & Sports.

#### 3.2.5 School Coordinator:

- Collaborate with club coordinators in identifying and selecting students for teams.
- Assist the Deputy/Assistant Director of Physical Education & Sports during Inter-School and other University-level events.
- Liaise and cooperate with the Deputy/Assistant Director of Physical Education & Sports as needed.
- Maintain records of all students from the respective school/department.
- Submit all details related to school teams to the Deputy/Assistant Director of Physical Education & Sports.
- Prepare students for Intra-school and Inter-school events.

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# CHAPTER-IV COMMITTEES

#### 4.1 UNIVERSITY SPORTS COMMITTEE

The University Sports Committee shall be formed at the commencement of each academic year, and its composition shall be as follows:

Chairperson: Honourable Vice-Chancellor

Member-Secretary: Director of Physical Education & Sports.

#### Members:

- Registrar, IIMT University.
- Three Experts from the Physical Education & Sports field as recommended by the Director of Physical Education & Sports.
- Sports Coordinators from all the schools/Colleges of the University as recommended by the Director of Physical Education & Sports.

# 4.1.1 Responsibilities of The University Sports Committee:

- Develop sports policies and periodically establish rules and regulations for the Physical Education & Sports program.
- Propose measures to enhance sports activities within the University.
- Recommend strategies to conduct sports activities in line with the University budget allocation and allocation of the University sports development fund for sports activities & development programs.
- Formulate guidelines for the admission of students under the "Sports Quota" in the University.

Establish guidelines for awarding sports scholarships to exceptional sportspersons at the University.

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- Approve the names of qualified Physical Education and Coaching professionals to serve on various selection committees for selecting sportspersons for the University teams.
- The Director of Physical Education & Sports will suggest the names of experts for inclusion in the selection committees, and these are presented to the University Sports Committee for approval.

# 4.1.2 Meeting of the University Sports Committee:

- The Sports Committee is scheduled to convene twice annually, typically in July and February.
- In the event of a valid reason, an extraordinary meeting of the Sports Committee may be called by the member-secretary.

# 4.1.3 Agenda at the Meeting of the University Sports Committee:

- Review and approval of the annual budget estimates for the Department of Physical Education & Sports.
- Review and approval of a panel of committee members for the selection of sportspersons for Inter-University competitions.
- Review and approval of the budget estimate for the felicitation function of All India Inter-University tournament medalists, incentives for Inter-School champions, and others.
- Planning the organization of any Inter-University tournament allotted by the A.I.U.
- Any other matters related to sports activities may be taken up for discussion and decision with the permission of the Chairman.

#### 4.2 SELECTION COMMITTEE

4.2.1 The following members will constitute the committee:

Director of Physical Education & Sports

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- Assistant Director of Physical Education & Sports
- Respective Coachof thesport
- School Sports Coordinators
- Sports Officer

# 4.2.2 The responsibilities of the Selection Committee:

- · Selection of teams for practice sessions.
- · Selection of teams for AIU and other sports competition participation.
- Submitting all selected candidates' lists to the Department of Physical Education & Sports.
- To collect medical eligibility certificates from all selected students and ensure that all candidates are medically fit and eligible to participate.

# 4.3 GRIEVANCE AND DISPUTE RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

# 4.3.1 The following members will constitute the committee:

- Director of Physical Education & Sports
- School Sports Coordinators
- Club Coordinator
- Sports Officer

# 4.3.2 The responsibilities of the Grievances and Disputes resolution committee:

- To handle disputes during an event organized at University.
- To listen to the grievances of club members and to take suitable actions.

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• To report the matter to Director/Vice-Chancellor.

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# 4.4 PRE-ACTIVITY/GAME EVALUATION COMMITTEE

# 4.4.1 The following members will constitute the committee:

- Assistant Director Physical Education & Sports
- Doctor/Medical Assistant
- Club Coordinator
- Sports Officer

# 4.4.2 The responsibilities of the Pre-Activity/Game evaluation committee:

- To check the eligibility, fitness, and effectiveness of candidates for participation in competitions.
- Ensure that participants are well equipped with all needed items like costumes, sports kits, documents, etc. before going for participation.

#### 4.5 MEDICINE AND HEALTH COMMITTEE

### 4.5.1 The following members will constitute the committee:

- Assistant Director Physical Education and Sports
- Doctor
- Nurse
- Physiotherapist
- Club Coordinator

# 4.5.2 The responsibilities of the Medicine and Health Committee:

• To check the medical fitness of candidates for selection in clubs.

To ensure that students are well informed about all medical precautions and guidelines before participating in events.

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# CHAPTER-V SYSTEM AND PROCEDURES

# 5.1 FORMATION OF CLUBS

- Enrollment for various clubs begins every year in the first month of the academic session.
- · A club coordinator will be appointed for each club.

#### 5.2 INTRA-SCHOOL COMPETITIONS

- The Intra-School competitions will be School level events by which students will be selected for Inter-School Meet.
- The schedule of the event will be determined by the Director of Physical Education & Sports and communicated to all school coordinators.
- It will be organized by school coordinators under the aegis of the Deans of the respective schools.
- The Department of Physical Education & Sports will guide and facilitate the whole event.
- Certificates and medals will not be provided for the Intra-School event.

#### 5.3 INTER-SCHOOL COMPETITIONS

- Inter-School meets will be organized by the Department of Physical Education & Sports.
- In this event teams from different schools of the University will participate.
- The school coordinator and any other such staff member appointed for the successful execution of club activities will cooperate with the Department of Physical Education & Sports during the event for the successful execution of the event.

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- If the entries for a standalone event are less than 5 then the event will be canceled.
- Certificates and medals will be provided to winners and organizing team members.

# 5.4 ASSOCIATION OF INDIAN UNIVERSITY TOURNAMENTS

The Association of Indian University (AIU) organizes National level Inter-University tournaments in which our University also takes part. The policies regarding the same are as follows.

# 5.1.1 Process of selection of University teams:

- The committee responsible for selecting players/teams for various Inter-University competitions will be constituted by the University Sports Committee.
- The selection committee, chaired by the Director of Physical Education & Sports, will consist of four members, comprising Physical Education & Sports/Coaching professionals and other personnel proposed by the Director of Physical Education & Sports as required.
- Only students meeting the eligibility criteria stipulated by the A.I.U, New Delhi will be eligible to participate in the selection process.
- Sportspersons participating in National Championships, International Championships, attending National level camps, and unable to attend or participate in the selection trials may be considered for selection at the discretion of the selection committee.
- The University team's captaincy will be determined by the Director of Physical Education & Sports based on Seniority / Game Knowledge / Discipline / Leadership Qualities / Participation in the National Championship / Achievements in the Inter-University tournaments /

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Chairperson competitions and National Championships / Class/Age.

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- The selection committee will choose players and stand-bys for the University teams based on their performance during the trials/competitions. If the performance standard of any team/player is deemed unsatisfactory by the committee members, such team/player may not be sent for participation in Inter-University tournaments.
- Attendance at University team coaching is mandatory. If any team player(s)
  are absent, stand-by(s) will be called for the camp. However, sportsperson(s)
  participating in National or International competitions during the University
  team's coaching camp may be exempted from attending.
- Disciplinary action, including barring the player from participating in Inter-School and Inter-University tournaments for one to two semesters, may be initiated based on the report submitted by the team manager/coach if any University player misbehaves during coaching/Inter-University tournaments /competitions.
- The University will bear the TA/DA expenses of University team players/managers/coaches and other accompanying officials according to provisions made by the University Sports Committee.
- University players/officials will be provided with track-suits/sports wears featuring the University logo, following the color combination proposed by the Director of Physical Education & Sports.
- University sportspersons participating in Inter-University tournaments will be covered by an appropriate accident/medical insurance scheme.
- After the team selection, all members will fill out a proforma as an undertaking to accept the code of conduct & penalties (in case of misconduct).
- University teams will participate in Inter-University competitions for Men & Women based on the Annual Calendar of National University Games recommended by the Association of Indian Universities every year.

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#### 5.5 COACHING CAMPS

- A practice camp of two weeks/available duration will be arranged by the University.
- During this period complete food and lodging facilities will be provided to the teams (only those representing University at AIU) by University. The facilities include accommodation (in hostels), breakfast, lunch, dinner, and refreshments.
- The players will be given duty leave/attendance for the duration of participating Inter-University tournaments and coaching camp as per the University norms.
- Any external coach taking the coaching camp will be paid Rs. 500 per day as coaching charges and Rs. 100 per day as a conveyance allowance if applicable.

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# **CHAPTER-VI**

# APPRECIATIONS, INCENTIVES, AND SCHOLARSHIP

#### 6.1 INTER-SCHOOL COMPETITIONS

### 6.1.1 Merit Certificates:

 The top three position holders in the Inter-School tournaments/competitions will receive merit certificates.

#### 6.1.2 Medals:

 Gold, Silver, and Bronze medals will be presented to the first, second, and third-place winners, respectively, in the Inter-School competitions.

# 6.1.3 Trophies:

- All trophies for the Inter-School tournaments/competitions will be rolling trophies, and the records of existing trophies will be meticulously maintained by the Department of Physical Education & Sports.
- The ownership of the trophies lies with the Department of Physical Education & Sports.
- The creation of rolling trophies is permissible only when they adhere to the specifications outlined by the Department of Physical Education & Sports.

# 6.1.4 Attendance:

 Players involved in the University Inter-School tournaments/competitions will receive attendance as per the University norms.

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# 6.2 INTERNATIONAL, NATIONAL AND AIU TOURNAMENTS

Prize-winning sportspersons (Medalists) in the above tournaments/ competitions will receive the following incentives. The University Sports Committee reserves the right to modify the proposed cash award as needed.

# 6.2.1 Officials (Coach/Manager/Assistant):

- 1st Position: each personwill receive -Rs. 5,000.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Position:each person will receive -Rs.4,000.
- 3rd Position:each person will receive Rs.3,000.

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# 6.2.2 Costumes & Sports Kits:

- For representing University in Inter-University tournaments/competitions, students will receive costumes/sports kits worth Rs. 1000/- per individual with the University's name printed on them.
- Before going for the Inter-University tournament all the team members are required to get the costumes/sports kits issued by the Department of Physical Education & Sports.

# 6.3 EQUIPMENT

 The Department of Physical Education & Sports will provide all necessary equipment for practice and participation in AIU/External tournaments.

#### 6.4 AIU CONTINGENT

- For AIU participation a contingent including participants, coaches, and staff
  members to be sent along with the teams will be recommended by Assistant
  Director and will be approved by Director.
- The facilities provided to the contingent are mentioned in subsequent sections.

#### 6.5 REGISTRATION CHARGES

 University will bear all forms of registration and officiating charges for the students representing IIMT Universityin AIU tournaments/competitions on prior approval of participation of the Department of Physical Education & Sports.

 Such facilities may also be provided for other off-campus sports events participation on the recommendation of the Director of Physical Education

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#### 6.6 TRANSPORTATION FACILITY

- Bus facility will be provided by University to the AIU contingents for tournaments held at local venues. The Director and Assistant Director are entitled to travel by car on University expenses.
- If the venue for the AIU sports competition is outstation, then 3-tier (3AC) train/bus fare will be provided for the to & fro journey of the contingents.
   The Director and Assistant Director, in such cases, are entitled to facilities as mentioned in the University TA/DA policy.
- Local conveyance for moving from University to Railway Station/Bus Stand and from the Bus Stand/Railway Station to University could be provided if deemed necessary by University authorities.
- The contingents may hire a local conveyance at the venue if required on approval of the Director of Physical Education & Sports.
- If the presence of any additional staff member/experts other than the contingent members is felt necessary by authorities during the participation in the AIU sports competitions then actual TA will be provided by University.
- Such facilities may also be provided for other off-campus sports events participation on the recommendation of the Director of Physical Education & Sports.

#### 6.7 DEARNESS ALLOWANCE

- Students will get Rs.300 per day as DA and Rs. 50 per day as a refreshment allowance during AIU competitions.
- Faculty/Staff accompanying the students will get a DA of Rs.500 per day during AIU tournaments/competitions.
- Such facilities may also be provided for other off-campus sports events participation on the recommendation of the Director of Physical Education

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#### 6.8 ACCOMMODATION CHARGES

- The University will bear the accommodation charges up to Rs. 300/ per diem for all AIU competitions.
- Such facilities may also be provided for other off-campus outstation sports events participation on the recommendation of the Director of Physical Education & Sports.

#### 6.9 DUTY LEAVE

- All the students/staff who are members of the contingent representing IIMT
  University in AIU competitions will get duty leaves during the period of the
  event.
- Any student/staff member engaged in a practice session on a recognized event will also be eligible for duty leave.

#### 6.10 OFFICIATING CHARGES

Officials/Judges invited from outside the University conducting the University events will be paid TA/DA and officiating charges given as under:

 Per day rate of Rs. 1500/- to Rs. 2000/- may be paid to match officials. (also depends on the federation to federation)

OR

- T.A Actual Bus/Rail Fare
- D.A Rs.500/- per day
- Officiating Charges
  - Officiating charges of Rs. 300/- per match for the games which have a duration of the complete match of less than 2 hours.
  - Rs. 450/- per match for the games which have a duration of more than 2 hours.

- The scholarship awarded upon admission is specifically designated for the first year of admission.

- Scholarships will not be extended based on participation in invitational tournaments of any nature.

# Requirements to Sustain Scholarship Eligibility:

- Maintaining a minimum attendance of 75% in the practical/coaching classes, including approved duty leave is mandatory.
  - o Recipients falling under Sports Scholarship categories "C, D and E" attendance submission must be routed through Sports Officer.
  - Recipients falling under "A and B" categories, attendance submission must be routed through the appropriate channels i.e Federation, Association, Coaching Centre, Sports Academy etc.
- Submission of an achievement certificate for the current academic session is mandatory. This documentation ensures the continuation of Sports Scholarship benefits for the upcoming academic session.
- Attendance at all external examinations administered by the university is compulsory.

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# CHAPTER-VII MISCELLANEOUS RULES

#### 7.1 MISCELLANEOUS RULES

- Competitions in all the events will be conducted as per AIU/NSF rules.
- University teams will be permitted to participate in events conducted by AIU, NSFs, SAI, and MYAS only. Duty Leaves will also be given to the students participating in these events.
- All the players will sign an undertaking before going to a competition.
- The appointment of a Captain is an honor to a student. No other additional benefit will be given to a captain.
- Sub-Standard teams or individual students will not be sent for the Inter-University competitions.
- If an exam is scheduled during Inter-University competitions, the participants must adhere to the examination policy as stipulated by Examination and Evaluation Department.
- Referees, umpires, and judges for all the Inter-University events will be appointed by the Department of Physical Education & Sports.
- One University Blazer/Track Suit will also be provided to the coach and Manager who accompany the University team for Inter-University participation.
